We thank you for your interest in the NGC. Members agree to annually donate two handmade items or make a cash donation to enable our Purchasing Chair to buy items. Tax receipts are issued for donations of at least \$10. Members are organized into named groups, each headed by a Convenor who is responsible for gathering donated items each fall. New members may join as groups or as individuals who will be assigned to a group. Some groups meet to knit and others prefer to knit by themselves.

OUR AGE CATEGORIES:

Infants (newborn to 24 months)	Ladies/Teens
Toddlers (2 – 6 years)	Men/Teens
Children (7 – 12 years)	

WHAT WE NEED:

1. **Hats, mitts, scarves, headbands:** all ages (no infant scarves)
2. **Two piece hat & scarf sets:** teens, women & men
3. **Sweaters:** all ages
4. **Blankets:** infants (see sizing guide)
5. **Lap robes and afghans:** adults (see sizing guide)
6. **Shawls:** teens/women
7. **Toys:** infants
8. **Layettes:** infants

- Infant/toddler mitts - strings requested; infant hats – toques or beanies instead of bonnets with ties
- Any colour is acceptable for handmade/purchased items
- Items that are not needed: doilies, dishcloths, hot mats, tea cosies
- Please try to have knitted items made to the measurements given below
- Purchased and handmade items must be machine washable
- Items that are parts of a set must be fastened together. (mittens, hat & sweater sets, hat & scarf sets)

SIZE GUIDELINES FOR HEADBANDS:

Children: 2" to 3" wide, **Teens/Adults:** 4" wide

SIZE GUIDELINES FOR SCARVES:

Children: 24" to 48" long, 4" to 5" wide, **Adults:** 36" to 60" long, 6" to 8" wide

SIZE GUIDELINES FOR BLANKETS/LAP ROBES/AFGHANS

Layette blanket	40" x 40"
Large stroller	36" x 40"
Small stroller/car seat blanket	18" x 20"
Receiving blanket (flannel)	30" x 36" or 36" x 36"
Isolette blanket	25" x 25"
Large play blanket for floor use	36" x 36"
Adult lap-robos	36" x 36"
Adult afghans	48" x 72"

Blankets may be knitted, crocheted, quilted or created with purchased fleece. Note: square blankets are best for swaddling.

SWEATERS BY AGE RANGE: (measurement of finished garment is underarm to underarm across back)

Layette Sweaters: 10 inches underarm to underarm across back

Infants (0-24 mos): 9 - 13 inches underarm to underarm across back

Finished chest	26"	28"	30"	Finished chest	32"	34"	36"
Finished Back	13"	14"	15"	Finished Back	16"	17"	18"

CAMP KITS: include one each - a toothbrush, washcloth, soap, small shampoo, toothpaste, comb (no rat-tail) tissue pocket pack which should be placed in a small ziplock bag. Convenor will provide further info.

LAYETTES: (for newborn to 3 months): 1 bath towel, 4 baby washcloths, 2 receiving blankets, 1 sweater & hat set, 2 prs socks/booties, 1 baby soap, 1 change pad, 12 disposable diapers, 3 grow vests, 3 sleepers, 2 bibs, 1 layette blanket/quilt, 1 soft toy, 1 petroleum jelly, 1 pkg baby wipes. Packed in small laundry basket, placed in clear bag and tied with ribbon. Convenor will provide further info.
